

2026 PARK COUNTY FAIR - 4-H STALL FEE POLICY

\$50 per stall – fully refundable if the stall is cleaned and approved by 5:00 PM on Sunday July 19th.

- Beef and horse stalls are charged per head – \$50/head
- Sheep, goats, pigs, mini horses, and donkeys are allowed a maximum of 2 animals per stall; these are charged \$50 per stall
- All small animal barn entries (chickens, ducks, rabbits, turkeys, etc.) will be charged \$50 per pen, with a maximum of 3 animals per pen
- Checks must be made out to Park County Fair Board
- One check per child, with the child's name written in the memo line
- Fees are due at time of check-in with your animals
- A Fair Board member will be collecting checks at the time of animal check-ins
- NO tack or feed stalls allowed under this policy
- Non-4-H project animals or participants – including any Tiny Tot animals – pay \$20 per stall, per day

Kennedy Zuber will oversee checking in and out of the small animal barn!

Elizabeth Woodward will oversee checking in and out of the 4-H horse stalls

As time gets closer, we will provide the names of the Livestock Barn representatives (Pig, Goat, Lamb, and Beef) who will be collecting checks at check-in. This way, you'll know exactly who to look for to hand off your stall deposit check.

On Sunday morning, two individuals will be stationed in the Livestock Barn to inspect stalls. If your stalls are cleaned and approved, your check will be returned on the spot. If you choose not to clean your stalls, that is your decision—your check will then be used to cover the cost of cleaning.

IMPORTANT REMINDER: ALL ANIMALS ARE REQUIRED TO REMAIN ON THE FAIRGROUNDS, STALLED, AFTER CHECK-IN UNLESS RELEASED OR APPROVED BY THE SPECIES SUPERINTENDENT.
